Austrian Army Of The Napoleonic

Austria was one of the five major players of the Napoleonic Wars. The Austrian Imperial-Royal Army (Kaiserliche-Königliche Heer) was large and well trained. In 1809 it comprised 261,000 infantry (215,000 line, 2,500 jagers, and 44,000 border), 59,000 cavalry (inc. 21,300 hungarian hussars) and 12,000 artillerymen.

For the Austrian army, a huge force of 300,000 regulars and 150,000 landwehr, the nine small units were too little to make any a meaningful impact on military operations. To remedy this situation the Austrians also used the Grenzers (border) infantry and the various small units of volunteers and skirmishers.
