During the Roman Republic, Rome divided Hispania into 2 provinces: 'Hispania Citerior' (Near Spain) and 'Hispania Ulterior' (Far Spain) (see map 1 - 56 BC). During the reign of Augustus, the last tribal areas of Hispania were conquered and Hispania was redivided into 3 provinces: Lusitania in the West, Baetica in the South, and Tarraconensis in the rest of the Peninsula and the Balearic Islands.
